REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MAY 7, 2025 AT 6:00 P.M. MILES CITY HALL

Mayor Pro-Tem Laura Horst called the regular council meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. N. Voss, L. Horst, N. Corlis, R. Wilslef, and A. Petersen were present. Mayor Pro-Tem Laura Horst presided.

Agenda: The agenda was approved unanimously.

GUESTS: Several individuals were present, including Eldon Schneider, Dennis Johnson, Deb Chrest. Carla Jochum, Officer Adam McPherson, and Paul Maze.

Eldon Schneider, Origin Designs approached the council with an agreement to prepare Preliminary Engineering Reports for the proposed Water Meter and Water Main Improvements in the City of Miles, IA. The City has approached East Central Intergovernmental Association (ECIA) to assist with the preparation of an application to the Iowa Economic Development Authority (EDA) for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for the installation of water meters and replacement of aged water mains and aged, non-functioning water main valves throughout the community. The CDBG application requires that a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) be prepared and submitted to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) for approval. The city has asked Origin Design to prepare and submit a PER for the proposed project to the Iowa DNR and assist the City and ECIA as needed for the CDBG grant application. The submission of Preliminary Engineering Report, Environmental Review Checklist, and Intended Use Plan to the Iowa DNR on or before August 1, 2025.

PUBLIC HEARING: Budget Amendment FY2024-2025.

Motion by R. Wilslef to open the public hearing at 6:05 p.m., seconded by N. Corlis. Motion carried.

Mayor Pro-Tem Laura Horst opened the public hearing to solicit comments for the FY2024/2025 Budget. The primary purpose of the public hearing is for citizens to voice their objections or concerns. Mayor Pro-Tem Laura Horst closed the public hearing at 6:07 p.m. with no negative comments from citizens present and no objections on file.

Motion by A. Petersen and seconded by N. Voss to close the Public Hearing for the 2024-2025 FY Budget Amendment at 6:07 p.m. No citizens comments, verbal or written oppositions were presented. Motion carried by roll call: A. Petersen ayes: N. Voss ayes: R. Wilslef ayes: N. Corlis ayes: L. Horst ayes.

Maintenance report was reviewed and placed on file.

New Business:

A motion was made by N. Voss and seconded by N. Corlis to approve Resolution 2025-10, A Resolution approving the Budget Amendment FY2024-2025. N. Voss ayes: N. Corlis ayes: R. Wilslef ayes: A. Petersen ayes: and L. Horst ayes:

N. Voss raised concerns about the project cost and inquired whether the funding would come from the water budget. The Clerk asked if the CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) would cover the engineering costs. Eldon explained that while the CDBG grant would cover the main project expenses, the engineering fees would be included in the SRF (State Revolving Fund) Loan, which is a low-interest loan for the entire project. The city will have the option to proceed with just the water meters or to complete both components of the project.

Dennis Johnson asked about the lifespan and warranty of the water meters. Paul responded that water meters typically last up to 20 years and do come with a warranty.

R. Wilslef made a motion to enter into an agreement with Origin Designs to complete the scope of services for the Water Meter and Water Main Improvements. The motion was seconded by A. Petersen. Motion carried.

Motion by N. Corlis and seconded by N. Voss to approve the 2nd Reading of Ordinance 02-2025, An Ordinance Amending Title III, Chapter 3, Community Protection Traffic Code of the City of Miles of Ordinances by Amending Section 3-3-36 Limited Parking Zone. N. Corlis ayes; N. Voss ayes; R. Wilslef ayes; A. Petersen ayes: and L. Horst ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by A. Petersen and seconded by R. Wilslef to suspend the rules requiring and ordinance be voted on for passage at two council meeting prior to this meeting with respect to Ordinance 02-2025. A. Petersen ayes; R. Wilslef ayes; N. Voss ayes; N. Corlis ayes; and L. Horst ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by N. Voss and seconded by A. Petersen to approve final passage and adoption with respect to Ordinance 02-2025, An Ordinance Amending Title III, Chapter 3, Community Protection Traffic Code of the City of Miles of Ordinances by Amending Section 3-3-36 Limited Parking Zone. N. Voss ayes; A. Petersen ayes; N. Corlis ayes; R. Wilslef ayes; and L. Horst ayes. Motion carried.

Ann Keeney is requesting approval from the council to obtain a variance for a deck she plans to build. The proposed deck would be located 3 feet from the property line, which does not meet the ordinance requirement of a 5-foot setback. She is seeking a variance to allow the project to move forward despite this discrepancy. N. Voss made a motion to grant Ann Keeney a variance for her deck; R. Wilslef seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Storm Drain Project – Bid Summary and Initial Considerations Project Location: 442 & 107 Ferry Road

The city recently solicited bids for a storm drain repair project. The following three bids were received:

- Ground Line Co. \$50,001.00
- Connolly Construction \$48,743.20
- Eastern Iowa Plumbing \$17,300.00

After review, it was noted that Eastern Iowa Plumbing submitted the lowest bid. Paul informed the council at 107
Ferry Road that the original plan would need to be re-routed and the material costs would be higher. After Paul
explained how the storm drain at that location will be re-routed. N. Voss made a motion to award the bid to
Eastern lowa Plumbing in the amount of \$17,300.00; seconded by R. Wilslef. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT - With nothing further to be brought before the city council meeting. N. Corlis made a motion to
adjourn the meeting; N. Voss seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 6:37 p.m. Motion caried.
