REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING SEPTEMBER 3, 2025 AT 6:00 P.M. MILES CITY HALL

Mayor Brandon Meyer called the regular council meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. PRESENT: N. Voss, L. Horst, N. Corlis, R. Wilslef, and A. Petersen. Mayor Brandon Meyer presided.

Agenda: The agenda was approved unanimously.

GUESTS: Several individuals were present, including Glen Mommsen, Dennis Johnson, Jesse Jepsen, Marc Ruden, Police Officer Adam McPherson, Todd Volquardsen, and Paul Maze.

Citizens/Public Comments – Marc Ruden addressed the Council regarding the water services engineering agreement for the Water System Improvements and Meter Replacement Plan. He noted that while the total project cost is \$82,000, the City's share to position itself for the CDBG grant is \$67,600—approximately \$10,000 less than previously anticipated.

Marc explained that if the city does not receive the CDBG grant, the \$67,600 investment would not be wasted, as it provides a complete set of usable construction documents. In the event of a future grant application, those documents could still be used without additional work.

Mayor confirmed that the remaining project costs (approximately \$15,000) would be addressed later when the project moves forward to construction and bidding.

Mayor questioned regarding the "opinion of probable project cost. Marc explained that these figures are engineers' estimates and may vary once the project goes to bid, though contingencies are included based on current contractor pricing and market conditions.

Following discussion, L. Horst made a motion to approve the Engineering Agreement for the Water System Improvements Project. The motion was seconded by N. Voss. Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA – N. Voss made a motion to approve the consent agenda, including the minutes of previous meeting, paid, unpaid, July financial statements, water, sewer, maintenance, and police report, the motion was seconded by A. Petersen. Motion carried.

MAINTENANCE REPORT - was reviewed and placed on file.

NEW BUSINESS

L. Horst made a motion to approve the Water System Improvement Project Engineering Agreement; N. Voss seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A motion was made by N. Corlis to approve Res. 2025-15, A Resolution approving Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) 2024-2025 Street Finance Report and authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to sign, L. Horst seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mayor and Council discussed the Fall Newsletter 2025. R. Wilslef made a comment to add about unattended fire pits. Fire pits must be attended at all times. If unattended, they are required to be fully extinguished in accordance with County Code.

The Clerk informed the mayor that she had emailed Mel Pins from the DNR to inquire about potential funding for 332 Ferry Road. Mel explained that his program is not intended to provide funds if the City does not move forward with use or redevelopment of the property once the grant is closed. Since no action has been taken on 346 Ferry Road, funds are not available at this time.

Following this information, the Clerk and Mayor consulted with the City Attorney regarding Mr. Pins' statement about the redevelopment of 346 Ferry Road. Based on the City Attorney's recommendation, the Council agreed that the City should request proposals for the purchase and development of 346 Ferry Road, with specific stipulations requiring redevelopment of the property. N. Voss made a motion to direct the City Attorney to prepare a Request for Proposals. The motion was seconded by A. Petersen. Motion carried.

Mayor and council discussed Trick or Treat times. The council declared Trick-or-Treat Saturday, November 1st from 4-6 p.m.

A motion was made by L. Horst to approve Res. 2025-16, A Resolution approving Urban Renewal Report for Fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, A. Petersen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Dawn Danielson from ECIA inquired about the property at 332 Ferry Road. The Clerk explained to her the comments made by Mel Pins regarding 346 Ferry Road. Ms. Danielson recommended the city begin with a Phase I assessment under ECIA's Brownfield Assessment Grant. If the City chooses, ECIA can order the Phase I at no cost to the city, with Geosyntec serving as the consultant firm. A Phase I provides a history report of the site and satisfies purchaser due diligence requirements, enabling the City to pursue Brownfield funds to assist with cleanup if the City acquires the property. N. Corlis made a motion to approve ECIA to move forward with a Phase I assessment for 332 Ferry Road under the Brownfield Assessment Grant. The motion was seconded by R. Wilslef. Motion carried.

Mayor announced next council will be held Wednesday, October 1, 2025 at 6:00 p.m.

ADJOURNMENT – With nothing further to be brought before the city council, N. Voss made a motion to adjourn the meeting, N. Corlis seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 6:21 p.m. Motion carried.
